

#### RELEVENCE OF SWAMI VIVEKANANDA'S PHILOSOPHY IN MODERN TIMES



The program commenced around 11:00 a.m. with the lighting of lamps and a devotional song, graced by the presence of our principal, Dr. Samapti Saha, faculty members, and students.

The department chose the topic "The Relevance of Swami Vivekananda's Philosophy in Modern Times." The esteemed guest and speaker, Maharaj Shivapremanandaji from Ramakrishna Mission Ashram, focused on three key elements: Concentration, Confidence, and Character, emphasizing their significance in the realm of education. He highlighted the challenges faced by mobile users in maintaining focus on serious issues, advising learners to

trust themselves first, making it easier to trust others.

The discussion captivated the attention of all students, as the speaker delved into moral dimensions and the development of human character through a combination of intellectual and spiritual powers. Drawing on Swami Vivekananda's words, "Manifesting the perfection already within man," he urged listeners to resist the mind from the clutches of impermanence, characterised by the temporary flow of events.



In the subsequent presentation, Dr. Samir Kumar Dasgupta discussed Swami Vivekananda's vision for the future of women. Exploring the women's movement from 1770-1928, he highlighted Vivekananda's perspective on women's liberation, emphasizing the importance of a woman's courage to protest any adverse situation undermining her prestigious position. The speaker's narrative, particularly focused on the life of Shree Stree Ma Sarada, resonated enthusiastically with learners.
